2019-20 Site Goals

1. CAASPP Participation & Proficiency - Overall

By June 2019:

- 97% of our students in grades 3-5 will participate in the statewide summative assessments, California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP)

- Students in grades 3-5 will increase the overall level of proficiency or above in English Language Arts from 74% to 80% as measured by CAASPP

- Students in grades 3-5 will increase the overall level of proficiency or above in Mathematics from 78% to 80% as measured by CAASPP

2. CAASPP Participation & Proficiency - Males, 2+ Races, Students w/Disabilities

By June 2019:

- Results of male students will increase from 70% to 77% proficient or above in ELA as measured by CAASPP and reported on the Statewide Accountability Progress Report

- Results of students designated Two or More Races will increase from 78-80% proficient or above in ELA

- Results of students designated Students with Disabilities will increase from 39% to 54% proficient or above in ELA and 39% to 55% in Mathematics as measured by CAASPP and reported on the Statewide Accountability Progress Report

3. Attendance & Safety

By May 2019:

- 95% of fifth grade students will report they feel safe at school as measured by the District Climate Survey

- Students who report bullying on the blacktop will reduce from 50% to 30% as reported by the District Climate Survey

- Trends in average daily attendance will reveal 97%
